

Purpose

Use this form if both of the following statements apply to you:

- You are on academic probation or are returning to school after a period of academic probation.
- You have submitted a **2022-23 OSAP Application for Full-Time Students**.

Your eligibility for OSAP funding will be on hold until all pages of your completed form are received and reviewed by your financial aid office or the ministry.

Required documents

You may be required to provide a copy of your transcripts for your academic probation period. You do not have to purchase official transcripts; however, they must clearly show your name and the name of your postsecondary institution.

See 'Section B: Required documents' to determine if you need to provide a copy of your transcripts.

Review of academic probation

You may be eligible to have your academic probation removed. Contact your financial aid office if any of the following circumstances impacted your ability to maintain satisfactory academic progress:

- a new or pre-existing medical condition;
- a disability-related issue; or
- a family crisis.

How to submit this form

The quickest way to submit your form is to upload it to your OSAP account. Log into the OSAP website and go to your application to use the "Print or upload documents" button. Or, you can submit a paper copy as follows:

If you're going to a school in Ontario:

Send your completed form and any required documents to your school's financial aid office.

If you're going to a school outside of Ontario:

Deadline

This form and all required documents must be received by your financial aid office or the ministry no later than 40 days before the end of your 2022-23 study period.

To remain eligible for Full-Time OSAP, students are required to make satisfactory academic progress in their programs of study.

Requirements for satisfactory academic progress

1. Successful completion of a full-time course load

To be considered to successfully complete a full-time course load, students must achieve passing grades (as defined by their institution) in at least 60% (or at least 40% for students with permanent disabilities, or persistent or prolonged disabilities) of what their institution considers to be a (100%) full-time course load, for each study term funded through Full-Time OSAP.

Students who withdraw from full-time studies or drop below the required full-time course load (as defined by their institution) could be placed on OSAP probation or restricted from receiving Full-Time OSAP.

2. Successful progression through studies

Students must progress through the successive years of their program while in full-time studies.

Students who, for example, switch programs multiple times, constantly repeat a program, and/or take multiple programs at the same level of study could be considered to show failure of academic progress and could be placed on OSAP probation or restricted from receiving Full-Time OSAP for one year or more.

Help is available

Your school cares about your academic success. Check with either the Student Services or Financial Aid Office at your school about different resources available, such as academic counselling and accessibility services. Using these resources may help you with your academic performance.

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Section B: Required documents

Do any of the following statements apply to you:

- You are attending a different school from the institution that placed you on academic probation;
- You are attending a private institution in Ontario;
- You are attending Saint Paul University, Dominican University College, Michener Institute of Education at UHN, Royal Military College of Canada, Niagara Parks School of Horticulture; or
- You are attending a school outside of Ontario.

Yes – Required documents: You must include a copy of your postsecondary transcripts from your probation period.

No – Transcripts are not required.

Section C: Student declaration

- I understand that to remain eligible for OSAP, I need to successfully complete a 60% course load (or 40% if I self-identified as a student with a permanent disability, or persistent or prolonged disability, for OSAP purposes) each year I receive funding.
- I will take the necessary steps to improve my academic progress for the current academic year.
- I understand that if I fail to successfully maintain satisfactory academic progress for the current academic year, I may be restricted from OSAP for a minimum of one year.
- I understand that if I continue to fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress in successive years, I may be ineligible for OSAP for multiple years.
- I will contact my financial aid office if I have any questions about the minimum academic standard required to remain eligible for OSAP consideration.
